NATURE RESERVE IN KULLABYGDEN Wellcome - an adventure awaits you!

Experience a dramatic scenery, salt-sprayed coastal heathland, shallow sandy beaches and singing frogs! Explore a cave, go bird watching or maybe spot a porpoise?

Here you can get a taste of what our beatiful nature has to offer. Welcome to the nature reserves of Kullabygden!



VÄSBY STRANDMARK

Between Letberget and Viken there is a small strip of coastal heathland and a sandy beach. In the summer the heath is full of thyme, sandy everlasting and wind flowers ..

The mixture of bare sand and flowering heath is a good environment for many insects.

Highlights: *Discover the sea holly, a thorny but rare plant* with blue flowers that grows mainly on sandy beaches. Sea *holly is critically endangered!*

NYHAMNSLÄGE-STRANDBADENS

KUSTHED Ancient heathland with fine flora, an inviting sandy beach and a ridge near Kullaberg and Mölle in the north. The shallow coastal area and reef at Kullens Harsbad are important resting areas for

seabirds. Various waders, ducks and plovers can be seen throughout the year.

Highlights: The crooked pines that line the reserve are perfect for climbing and playing. In summer, the shallow sandy beaches are ideal for swimming.

Highlights: The small pools are home to bell frogs and salamanders.

MÖLLEHÄSSLE



Salty, grazed beach meadows southeast of the village of Mölle, framed by winding stone fences and windswept trees. In early summer, orchids and beach grass bloom and the lark's call can be heard in the wind.

Highlights: The sunset over the sea and the sound of bell frogs singing from the shallow ponds.

KULLABERG



Wild, beautiful and wonderful. Like a green sinuous dragon, the primeval ridge of Kullaberg towers over the tip of the Kulla Peninsula. In places, the mountain plunges almost 100 metres straight into the sea. The dramatic coastline is

carved with coves, cliffs, caves and sea stacks that invite adventure. Beneath the surface is a diving paradise and Sweden's only resident whale, the porpoise. A hike around the mountains takes you through lush deciduous forest, down deep ravines and up to pastures with spectacular views.

Highlights: Kullaberg is an outdoor enthusiast's dream - visit the lighthouse, hike. climb, snorkel, fish, birdwatching or sea kayak. The list goes on and on !




A small hillside lined with ancient oak trees,

LUNNABJÄR

surrounded by meadows and fields. **Highlights:** Spring flora including spring onions, marsh marigold and swallow-wort.

NABBEN

Highlights: The mile-long view from Nabbahögarna (Bronce Age burial mounds) to Arild, the northern slopes of Kullaberg, further out to Skälderviken and the Bjäre peninsula.

SKÄRET



A small fractured ancient cultural landscape sandwiched between buildings. In several places in the reserve there are pastures with scattered older trees and cairns. Most of the trails in the area are remnants of old footpaths

and roads.

Highlights: If you are lucky, you might catch a glimpse of a rare black viper sunning itself on a hillside.

BÖLSÅKRA - TRANEKÄRR

The rocky coastline between Svanshall and Skäret offers wonderful views of Skälderviken and Hallands Väderö in the distance. You walk through heather-covered cliffs and small harbours.

Highlights: In the far east is a water-filled quarry, a perfect place for a picnic and play.

JONSTORP-VEGEÅS MYNNING

From Svanshall in the west to Utvälinge in the east, Skälderviken is a largely marine nature reserve. Seaweed beds serve as nurseries for flatfish and cod. At low tide, the sandy and muddy bottoms are exposed, providing a feast for birds.

Highlights: Rönnen, Själrönnen and Sandön in particular attract many bird watchers. If you are lucky, you may even

GÖRSLÖVSÅNS MADER

The fields along the Görslövsån river are regularly flooded, hence the word "mad", a southern Swedish word for wet fields where hav

is harvested.

Highlights: Görslövsån is particularly rich in bird life, especially when the water level is high. *Large numbers of geese, ducks and waders nest and rest on* the river every year. Birds of prey sit on poles and look out for

Nature reserves often have special rules that restrict public access. At each reserve there are information signs where you can read the rules that apply to the particular reserve you are visiting.
